

Guided Reading Center Ideas

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You can search Google Books for any book or topic. In this case, let's go with "Alice in Wonderland" since it's a well-known book, and there's probably a free eBook or two for this title. The original work is in the public domain, so most of the variations are just with formatting and the number of illustrations included in the work. However, you might also run into several copies for sale, as reformatting the print copy into an eBook still took some work. Some of your search results may also be related works with the same title.

Reading Centers for Upper Elementary - Practical ideas and ...

In my kindergarten class I normally have 24-26 students (which for me is 5 guided reading groups based on Fountas and Pinnell guided reading levels). I plan on meeting with all 5 groups each day. I normally only have 5 centers and just change them weekly (what a chore!).

Again, there are tons of possibilities, but here are a few suggestions: Do an echo read (one partner reads one page and the other partner echoes it) Do a choral read (partners read the whole book at the same time) Take turns reading pages of a book One partner reads an entire book and the other ...

As the teacher works with one group of students for guided reading, other groups rotate through the literacy centers in the classroom. Literacy centers can be created by simply setting out literacy activities on a table or they can be located in designated classroom areas.

Four different centers (in constant physical locations in the classroom) + my guided reading table; Centers were: word sort, sight words, independent reading, content-area or play-based literacy; Students go to 3 centers a day (1 can be a guided reading group with me) Kids work in heterogeneous (mixed ability) groups

Simple Kindergarten Literacy Stations

So the first 15 minutes, the Purple group goes to the Listening Center, then they switch to Silent Reading, then Meet with the Teacher, then finally Word Work. On Tuesday, the Purple group goes to Tech Time, Buddy Reading, Meet with the Teacher, then finally Respond in Writing. On Wednesday, they repeat the same centers and schedule as Monday.

What Do the Kids DO During ELA Centers? | 2nd Grade Stuff

Students can put sticky notes on words they know or cover words in a familiar Big Book with sticky notes and have a partner guess what they are. Or you can write word wall words on cards for students to match to words in the book. Students can read familiar Big Books with a pointer.

What to do with the rest of your students during guided ...

I place literacy centers in the even numbered drawers and the math in the odd numbered. This way, each time we rotate, students work on a different subject. Instead of baskets, I use sterlite drawers to store my centers. Students can easily pull them out and bring them to their work station.

My Center Rotation Routine - All Students Can Shine

We have Guided Reading/Centers Monday-Thursday from about 1:10-2:00 and I rotate through four groups. This means each center is 12 minutes long, with about 30 seconds for a transition. 12 minutes can fly by, so the students have to work on getting those transitions DOWN.
