5 Pro-active, positive behavior management strategies for every classroom 1) Have a routine in place for EVERYTHING and practice procedures, not punishment. Know all of your rules and procedures to the tiniest detail, and if a child stretches those rules even a tiny bit, call them on it.

5 Pro-Active Strategies for Positive Behavior Management

Be resilient. Celebrate the fun and the good things! Use positive/proactive language: Use language that describes what you want the individual to do (e.g. 'I love how you used a tissue!'), and try to avoid saying 'NO', or 'don't' (e.g. 'stop picking your nose').

2. Positive physical space. The physical layout and look of your classroom can be used to build positive emotions. Putting up positive visuals and quotes can inspire creative thinking and teamwork in your students. Increased natural light or soft lighting can enhance an open, warm, and relaxing environment.

Five Ways to Support Students Affected by Trauma

When students are able to make real connections to the world around them, or physically explore a concept, the knowledge will stick with them. Immediate and Positive Feedback: Positive feedback will encourage the student to keep on trying. If a student masters a concept or meets a goal it is important to reward or applaud the student immediately.

Positive reinforcement can be used very effectively in the classroom to create or enhance a desired behavior. The idea is basically to not focus on the negative aspects of a person's behavior, but instead to focus on the positive aspects. The more focus that is placed on the positive behavior, the more the behavior will be enhanced.
