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### Post Anesthesia Care Unit Guidelines

A Postanesthesia Care Unit (PACU) or an area which provides equivalent postanesthesia care (for example, a Surgical Intensive Care Unit) shall be available to receive patients after anesthesia care. All patients who receive anesthesia care shall be admitted to the PACU or its equivalent except by specific order of the anesthesiologist responsible for the patient's care.

POSTANESTHESIA CARE UNIT. 1. When discharge criteria are used, they must be approved by the Department of Anesthesiology and the medical staff. They may vary depending upon whether the patient is discharged to a hospital room, to the Intensive Care Unit, to a short stay unit or home. 2.

### Standards for Postanesthesia Care 2019

Right after surgery, you will be taken to the postanesthesia care unit (PACU) or directly to the intensive care unit where nurses will take care of you and watch you closely. A nurse will check your temperature, blood pressure and pulse often, look at your bandages, regulate your IV and give you pain medication as you need it.

### ASPAN - What to Expect in the Postanesthesia Care Unit

The Guidelines are intended for use by anesthesiologists and may also serve as a resource for other physicians and healthcare professionals who direct anesthesia or sedation and analgesia care. General medical supervision and coordination of patient care in the postanesthesia care unit (PACU) should be the responsibility of an anesthesiologist.

Post-operative orders must be communicated both verbally and documented in the EMR. Post-operative orders are additional to the operation report.

Every patient undergoing general anaesthesia or central neuraxial blockade for surgery should be recovered in a designated area. These post-anaesthesia care units, or PACUs, should comply with the standards and recommendations described in these guidelines and the supplementary document. ### Post Anesthesia Care Unit (PACU)

All patients are admitted to the Post-Anesthesia Care Unit (PACU) following surgery and anesthesia at HSS. The length of your stay in the PACU depends on several factors, including demonstrated recovery from anesthesia. If you have had epidural or spinal anesthesia, you must be able to feel and move your legs before being discharged from the PACU.

### Post Anesthesia Care (PACU) Guidelines | Anesthesia ...

The postanaesthetic care unit (PACU) addresses the need for an improved level of care for these patients by providing postoperative high-dependency or intensive care (Level 2 or 3). The PACU aims to improve the structure of care provision for high-risk surgical patients. By maintaining 24-hour cover at the same staffing level, the risk of poorer 'out-of- hours' care is reduced.

### Introduction to the postanaesthetic care unit ...

Postanesthesia care unit (PACU) discharge without observation of lower limb motor function after spinal anesthesia has been suggested to significantly reduce PACU stay and enhance resource optimization and early rehabilitation but without enough data to allow clinical recommendations.

### Post-Anesthesia Care Unit Staffing and Patient Flow

PACU (which stands for Post- Anesthesia Care Unit) is also called the recovery room. It is a specialized care unit near the operating room where patients who have had surgery are cared for as they wake up from anesthesia.

Postoperatively, all free TRAM flap patients are kept in the Post-Anesthesia Care Unit overnight to allow frequent flap monitoring. They receive IV antibiotics and deep vein thrombosis prophylaxis with low molecular weight heparin through the duration of their hospitalization.
