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The Sea Empress Spill The

The spill occurred within the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park – one of Europe's most important and sensitive wildlife and marine conservation areas. It was Britain's third largest oil spillage and the twelfth largest in the world at the time. The location where the Sea Empress ran aground. Sailing against the outgoing tide and in calm conditions, at 20:07 GMT the ship was pushed off course by the current and became grounded after hitting rocks in the middle of the channel.

The MV Sea Empress was a single-hull Suezmax oil tanker that ran aground at the entrance to the Milford Haven harbour on the southwest coast of Wales in February 1996. The ensuing oil spill , Britain's third largest oil spillage and the 12th largest in the world at the time, [1] devastated a considerable area of local coastline and killed many birds, and continued to affect the Pembrokeshire coast for years afterwards.

Fortunately, the impact of the spill was much less than would have been expected from the quantity of oil spilled. The Sea Empress ran aground ay the entrance to Milford Haven, South West Wales. Although the tanker was refloated within a couple of hours, it sustained serious damage to its starboard and centre tanks, resulting in a massive release of oil.

The Sea Empress Oil Spill in Milford Haven. On 15 February 1996, the Sea Empress oil tanker ran aground as it entered the Milford Haven Waterway. Six days later, the tanker refloated and was towed into the harbor. In the days between its grounding and towing, the oil tanker spilled 72,000 tons of crude oil along the Pembrokeshire Coastline, within the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park.

The Sea Empress spilled 70,000 tonnes of light crude oil following it's grounding on the 15th February, 1996. Of this 70,000 tonnes, it has been stated that up to 30,000 tonnes has 'evaporated'. This is not however a benign method of dispersal for the very light, volatile fraction of the oil, and the presence of known carcinogenic compounds within the oil gives cause for concern.
